# 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

# A. Eye contact

- Do not rub your eyes.
- Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes and call a doctor/physician.
- Get medical attention immediately.
- Go to the hospital immediately if symptoms(flare, irritate) occur.
- Remove contact lenses if worn.

## B. Skin contact

- Flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes.
- Wash contaminated clothing thoroughly before re-using.

- In case of accidental contact with liquefied gas or refrigerated liquefied gas, warm up the contact part with lukewarm water.
- Remove contaminated clothing, shoes and isolate.

- Wear gloves when washing the patient, and please avoid contact with contaminated clothing.

#### C. Inhalation contact

- When exposed to large amounts of steam and mist, move to fresh air.
- Take specific treatment if needed.

- If breathing is stopped or irregular, give artificial respiration and supply oxygen.

- Leaking gas fire: do not extinguish, unless leak can be stopped safely.
- Remove sources of ignition.
- Tanks, trailers, vehicle fire: FIRE recognize the possibility container.

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### A. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

- Ventilate closed spaces before entering.
- Must work against the wind, let the upwind people to evacuate.
