Description of necessary first aid measures

Eye contact

Skin contact

Section 5. Fire-fighting measures

Specific hazards arising from the chemical

: Extremely flammable aerosol. Runoff to sewer may create fire or explosion hazard. In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst, with the risk of a subsequent explosion. Gas may accumulate in low or confined areas or travel a considerable distance to a source of ignition and flash back, causing fire or explosion. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

For non-emergency personnel

Remark

: No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. Evacuate surrounding areas. Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. In the case of aerosols being ruptured, care should be taken due to the rapid escape of the pressurized contents and propellant. Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

Large spill

Precautions for safe handling
